[§]No initial / Passed outpatient refers to infants who did not receive an initial screening, missed an initial screening, or refused an initial screening, and passed the outpatient screening.

[¶]Passed initial / Passed outpatient refers to infants who passed the initial screening and passed the outpatient screening.

^{**}Referred initial / Passed outpatient refers to infants who did not pass the initial screening and passed the outpatient screening.

^{††}Referred initial / No outpatient refers to infants who did not pass the initial screening and did not receive an outpatient screening, missed an outpatient screening, or refused an outpatient screening.

^{§§}No initial / Referred outpatient refers to infants who did not receive an initial screening, missed an initial screening, or refused an initial screening, and did not pass the outpatient screening.

^{¶¶}Passed initial / Referred outpatient refers to infants who passed the initial screening and did not pass the outpatient screening.

^{***}Referred initial / Referred outpatient refers to infants who did not pass the initial screening and did not pass the outpatient screening.

^{†††}Referred initial / straight to diagnostic evaluation refers to infants who did not pass the initial screening and were referred directly for diagnostic evaluation.

An example of an outpatient screening is a hearing screening that is performed after an infant is discharged from a birthing facility (e.g., the infant is no longer a patient in the facility where they were born).
